You call in the middle of life when many pressures crowd upon us – Follow Me.

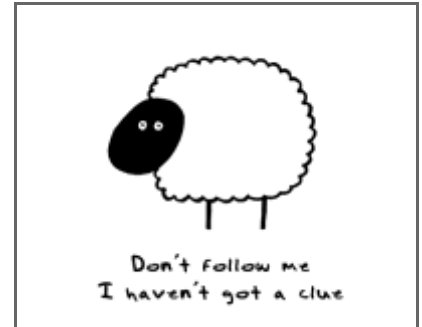
You call us at the end of life, when burdens are heavy and memories draw us back –

NEW COUNCILLOR The Council will be co-opting a new member at its next meeting. There are still three vacancies, see earlier editions of the Bridge for further details.

PLANNING MATTERS The following applications have been approved:- Unit 8a, Scotton Way, permission granted for the siting of a mobile catering unit and the Solar Farm on Redbridge Road, details of this and all planning applications can be found on thedorsetforyou web site. CONSERVATIONS AND COMMUNITY GRANT SCHEME West Dorset District Council has £17,000 available for grants of up to £3000 for groups and £1000 for individuals; these are available towards helping to improve the local landscape, the historic environment or community planning participation and projects. WINTER BRIEFING AT COUNTY HALL The Council will be sending a representative to the Winter Briefing being held at County Hall in October. A report will be given in the next edition of the Bridge.

SPORTS FIELD AND RECREATION COMMITTEE The Committee met on September 13th; the Chairman, Cllr Harris was able to report that there had been no major incidents reported and the MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) and the Rhodes Bowl were both well used and enjoyed during the summer. The members agreed to accept a Notice Board for the Sports Field sponsored by Talk Talk, this will be erected as soon as is possible and will be a useful addition; it will be used as a general notice board but especially giving advice on football

matches and events in the MUGA. A Memorial Bench dedicated to George Hood will be placed in the splay of the entrance to the sports field, a welcome addition to this area.



WOODSFORD FARMS The Council has received telephone calls regarding the appearance of a fence surrounding the open land abutting the School, properties in the new development and the Sports Field. **The Council made enquires of the owner's representatives and was advised that this fencing was put up to prevent the access within this land becoming a public footpath by way of a Permissive Path Law. A land owner is obliged to periodically restrict access to his land to prevent the access becoming a public right of way, (a Permissive Path).** Whilst the Council sympathises with walkers it remains that this land is not public land and the owners are exercising their rights as landowners.

The next scheduled meeting of the Parish Council will be the Sports Field and Recreation Committee which **will take place in the Sports Pavilion, Dick o' th' Banks Road on Tuesday the 15th November at 7pm.** The next meeting of the full council will take place on the Thursday the 27th October at 7pm in the Village Hall.

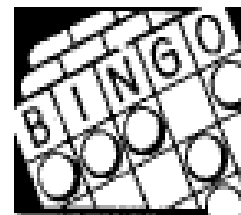

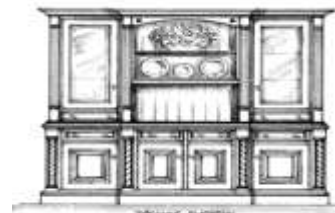

'ON THE BEAT'

OPERATION COUNTRYSIDE

Operation Countryside has been launched to drive down rural crime across the County of Dorset, by Dorset Police.

Rural crime cost the agricultural industry more than £49 million across the UK during 2010 and continuous to be a problem. A survey by the National Farmers Union showed that crime against agricultural industry was up by 17% on the previous year.

Last year in England and Wales 1975 tractors and other agricultural vehicles were stolen at a cost to the NFU Mutual in excess of £10 million. According to Farmers weekly the top 5 most stolen items are.

- . Tools Quad Bikes Oil and Diesel
- . Tractors Metals

Dorset Police are working with the rural community to raise the awareness of rural crime by promoting the importance of crime prevention and the necessity of the community reporting suspicious incidents as they happen. West Dorset is a very safe place to live and work together we can make it even safer.

FROM VICKIE HEDGES YOUR LOCAL PCSO I am often asked what a PCSO (Police Community Support Officers) does, my role is to provide the local communities I serve a contact point that they know and trust. I have developed a detailed working knowledge of the concerns and problems that the residents and businesses of Dorchester East face. I then work very closely with other public agencies to voice my communities concerns in order to solve those

problems. My shifts are very busy and there is often not enough time to do all I want, I consider myself extremely fortunate to work in such a beautiful location and am proud of the contribution I bring to make Dorset even safer.

The area I cover is relatively large and varied encompassing both coastal and inland, including the Owermoigne, Broadmayne, Piddle Valley, and Puddletown Wards. It consists of 30 odd villages as far south as Osmington to as far north as Duntish and Melcombe Bingham. Some are large like Crossways and others are as small as Athlehampton. I feel it is a privilege to be able to 'care for' such a beautiful area of rural Dorset. I serve approximately 10,000 residents, their children and their grandchildren, not forgetting second homeowners and holidaymakers. Hence, I can't always remember everyone by name, but I always remember a face. My duties involve maintaining a visible presence in villages, holding community surgeries to identify local concerns in numerous publicised venues, attending community meetings and events such as fetes and coffee mornings, intelligence gathering; attending multi-agency meetings with local councillors, community workers, giving crime prevention talks and advice; organising rural road safety events at local schools; meeting with locals business owners such as farmers; mediating neighbour disputes; dealing with anti social behaviour; directing traffic at the scene of an accident; administering first aid; dealing with untaxed or abandoned vehicles; seizing mini motor-bikes or other vehicles being driven in an anti-social manner causing harassment, alarm and distress; assisting Officers in searching for a missing person; manning a Police cordon in the event of a major incident; in line with my designated powers, issuing Fixed Penalty/Penalty Notice of Disor-
